Schlaepfer especially wants to use her film to highlight the seriousness of the psychological issues that the victims of these atrocities in Baghdad must live with. "Gangs of Baghdad" is an appeal to the human consciousness of all health institutions and humanitarian organizations — entities that are able to extend a helping hand to those psychologically affected by these crimes and horrible deeds — to take active measures and steps to ensure that these victims are rehabilitated and able to embark on a normal life once again.



Synopsis: In spite of the close proxim-

ity and the intermingling of people in the fabric of one society, we all live in a state of isolation. and equally strong wisdom. Children enjoy life in spite of meager means and have surprisingly simple dreams for the future. Those simple people know the meaning of contentment and the love of life in this place, of which we know nothing but it's name: Marazik.






